

# Free Cam Guide

Free Cam is a **free** screen recording software for Windows that is made for easily creating, editing and sharing beautiful screencasts. With Free Cam, you can record all the on-screen activity, lock recording to a specific application, presentation slide or record the entire screen.

Once you start the Free Cam tool, you will see a black-and-white border around the area to record and a toolbar that appears under the recording area.

1. **Start Recording**
2. **Mute/Unmute** a mic to record sound
3. **Size** of the recording area (menu)
4. **Settings**
5. **Done/Cancel** to end or cancel the recording.

Free Cam captures the action on the screen and records audio (microphone and system sound). You can disable both mic and system sounds in the [Settings](#) window.
